### PROCESS

-  Complete and submit application to MSOC
-  MSOC reviews application and conducts a Team Resource Visit
-  If approved and ready, community receives the Partner Level designation and benefits

### APPLICATION & PROGRAM COMPONENTS

-  Affirm local governmental support, including a new resolution if moving to a new level
-  Have a Board and By-Laws—with an Inclusion Policy, Conflict Policy and Code of Conduct Policy
-  Adequate budget for program
-  Vision, mission, market analysis and workplans are all formalized around economic strategies
