AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN FUNDING

\$1.05 Million
to fund the Oakland County Business Resource Network to help employees overcome a number of barriers to full-time employment

allocated for the Oakland County Childcare Scholarship Program, which provides \$1,200 grants to families struggling with this expense

\$1.5 Million
to provide a range of supportive services for individuals in training programs across the county

to fund the Oakland80 Career Navigators program designed to help people return to school and obtain a college degree or occupational certification
