52/2 DISTRICT COURT PROBATION TRAVEL POLICY

By state mandate, a probationer may not leave the state without consent of the court. During your probation term, any travel out of the state must be pre-approved by your supervising probation officer. Likewise, if you are on a regular testing program, you must obtain pre-approval for any instate travel if that travel may impact your ability to report to the designated testing agency.

Requesting Permission to Travel

Travel requests must be submitted <u>in writing</u> at least two weeks prior to the requested travel. Submission of a request does not guarantee approval. Once reviewed, your probation officer will contact you with a response. The request must include:

- Reason for travel
- Dates of departure and return
- Location/address of destination
- Telephone number where you can be reached while traveling
- Mode of transportation (driving, flying, etc). Verification may be requested (flight itinerary, hotel information, etc.)
- Phone number where you wish to be contacted in response to the travel request

Alcohol and Drug Testing

You may be subjected to alcohol and/or drug testing during your travel. If required, you must locate a testing site at your destination and provide the contact information to your probation officer <u>prior to departure</u>. Please note, testing while traveling must be appropriately documented and may be required at specific times of the day.

Travel requests will not be considered in the following circumstances:

- You are in non-compliance of any term of probation and/or have a pending violation hearing
- Request was submitted without sufficient notice (with the exception of emergency situations)
- Any fine/costs are outstanding or if you are behind in POE payments
- If the travel could negatively impact the goals of the probation term

Travel is a privilege while on probation and is at the discretion of your probation officer. Failure to abide by the above rules could result in denial of future requests and/or a hearing for violation of probation.
