2023 Poverty/Hardship Exemption Guidelines

The applicant is recommended to contact the local governing body directly for assistance.

MCL 211.7u provides for a property tax exemption, in whole or part, for the principal residence of persons who, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges.

APPLICATION

- 1. Eligibility To be eligible, a taxpayer shall do all the following on an annual basis:
 - A. Own and occupy the property as a principal residence.
 - B. Provide federal and state income tax returns for the current or immediately preceding year, including any property tax credits, for all persons residing in the principal residence (disclosure of the income of an owner who is not residing in the principal residence is not required). An alternative affidavit may be filed for all persons residing in the residence who were not required to file federal or state income tax returns in the current or immediately preceding year. (See Form 4988, Poverty Exemption Affidavit)
 - C. Produce a valid driver's license or other form of identification if requested.
 - D. Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property if requested.
 - E. Meet the asset level and/or any other tests set by the local governing body.
 - F. Meet the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines as defined and determined annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services or alternative guidelines adopted by the local governing body.

2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines

Persons in Family/Household	Poverty Guidelines
1	\$14,580
2	\$19,720
3	\$24,860
4	\$30,000
5	\$35,140
6	\$40,280
7	\$45,420
8	\$50,560

For families/households with more than 8 persons, add \$5,140 for each additional person.

2. Filing

Poverty/Hardship Exemption Application with required supporting information shall be filed after January 1, but before the day prior to the last day of the local unit's December Board of Review.

APPEAL RIGHTS

- A property owner or assessor may appeal a decision of the March Board of Review by completing and submitting a petition to the Michigan Tax Tribunal no later than July 31 of the same year. A property owner or assessor may appeal a decision of the July or December Board of Review by completing and submitting a petition to the Michigan Tax Tribunal within 35 days of the July or December Board of Review's denial of the poverty exemption.
- An application for poverty exemption, for a specific principal residence, may only be acted upon by the Board of Review once a year. If an application is denied at the March Board of Review, it may not be reheard by the July or December Board of Review during the same calendar year. The taxpayer must file an appeal of the March Board of Review determination to the Michigan Tax Tribunal. Similarly, if an application is denied at the July Board of Review, the December Board cannot rehear that application, the taxpayer must file an appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal.
- A person who files a claim for poverty exemption is not prohibited from also appealing the assessment on the same property in the same year.
