If You Find a Bat in Your Home

DO NOT LET THE BAT GO!

Watch

“How to Safely Catch a Bat”

Call Oakland County Animal Control (OCAC) to pick up the bat after it has been safely caught as described in the above video. If you are unable to catch the bat yourself, call a critter control agency for assistance. OCAC cannot catch bats in a home.

If Bitten by an Animal

- If you are bitten by a wild animal or seriously injured by a domestic animal

GO TO AN EMERGENCY ROOM OR URGENT CARE IMMEDIATELY

- Wound care will be given
- Tetanus vaccination status will be reviewed
- Need for rabies treatment will be evaluated

Rabies Prevention

- Keep pets (dogs, cats, ferrets) up-to-date on rabies vaccinations
- Stay away from wild or unfamiliar animals
- Report ill appearing wild animals to OCAC

What is Rabies?

- A disease caused by the rabies virus in mammals
- Affects the brain and nervous system
- Symptoms include:
 - Agitation
 - Difficulty Swallowing
 - Hydrophobia (fear of water)
 - Confusion
 - Paralysis
 - **Fatal without Treatment**

How is Rabies Transmitted?

- Contact with the **saliva** (bite, scratch or lick) of an infected animal
- Wild animals with potential to carry rabies:
 - Bats (most frequently reported rabid animal in Oakland County)
 - Skunks
 - Raccoons
 - Foxes
