Oakland County International Airport is the second busiest airport in Michigan with more than 100,000 takeoffs and landings and a 1/2 million passengers and pilots passing through each year. The airport has an annual impact of \$175 million on the region's economy.

Green Technology

- Tour the nation's first LEED-certified general aviation airport terminal.
- Encounter the living wall of tropical plants which filter the air inside the terminal. Plants are watered by rain from the rooftop.
- Experience wind and solar energy and geothermal heating and cooling technology.
- Check out electric vehicle charging stations.
- Discover how the airport conserves energy and protects natural resources.

Aviation

- Observe first-hand the equipment and personnel it takes to operate Michigan's second busiest airport.
- Witness aircraft taking off and landing.
- View the world's first aesthetic ground run-up enclosure which reduces post maintenance jet aircraft noise.
- Discover why OCIA is the gateway to Oakland County from the air, hosting aircraft from every Fortune 500 company, national politicians and celebrities.
- Learn how an international airport works with residents in adjacent communities to reduce noise issues.

History

- The U.S. government issued its first airport certification in February of 1930. See airport certification document No. 000001 for OCIA.
- Aviation Pioneer Orville Wright commemorated the first Michigan Air Tour held on June 10-16, 1929 with a National Aeronautic Association of U.S.A. certificate. View the document with Wright's signature.
- Marvel at a Pitts Special biplane suspended from the terminal ceiling. The plane was piloted by world famed stunt pilot Henry A. Haigh II and donated to OCIA by the Kalamazoo Air Zoo.
