The Birmingham Retention Treatment Basin facility is equipped with a generator in case of power failure at the site. During recent operation, the generator suffered a mechanical failure. Repair efforts have been made but unfortunately, multiple parts needed are obsolete and unavailable.

WRC staff requests approval of a project to replace the existing generator and associated automatic transfer switch which have both reached the end of their useful life. The total cost for this project is estimated at \$250,000.

To kick-off this project, we recommend awarding engineering services to Sigma Associates for the not-to-exceed amount of \$16,490 per the attached proposal and the terms of their existing contract with the County.

Per our recent discussions and emails, Sigma is pleased to submit this proposal to develop design documents to replace the Birmingham Retention Treatment Basin (RTB) permanent generator and replace/add related transfer switches as outlined below. These proposed services will improve station reliability and add flexibility during utility power outages.

BACKGROUND

The Oakland County WRC operates and maintains many pumping stations. This includes the Birmingham RTB site located 700 Linden Rd.in Birmingham for which OCWRC has determined that the generators and automatic transfer switches (ATS) there need to be replaced soon, with the addition of a new manual transfer switch (MTS). Reliable backup power is necessary to properly operate the station.

SCOPE OF WORK

For purposes of developing a budget for the design, Sigma anticipates and bases this scope of work on the following Sigma activities:

- 1. Conduct and participate in site visits, including one on-site discussion as a kick-off.
- 2. Review site relevant documents obtained from OCWRC.
- 3. Base design on an intermittent-duty, natural gas-fed, Cummins generator connected to a new automatic transfer switch (ATS) and existing loads, along with a new manual transfer switch (MTS) directly connected to MCC-2.

- 5. Conduct virtual design review meetings with OCWRC after 50% and after pre-final submission.
- 6. Develop drawings with specifications at the 50%, pre-final, and final milestones, and construction cost estimate at final.
- 7. Use existing methods for foundation/mounting.
- 8. Include contractor proper reconnection to the existing generator exhaust.
- 9. Review bidder questions and develop responses to technical questions; develop adjusted drawings and specifications as needed.
- 10. Prepare conformed contract documents including any adjustments to the design per the bidder questions.



ASSUMPTIONS

To develop the scope and budget for the project, Sigma has assumed the following:

- 1. Available site information will be provided by OCWRC. OCWRC personnel will be available for site investigation.
- During the investigation, OCWRC personnel will open panels to allow Sigma to observe details required for proper design.

Annually, the Drainage Board for the Clinton River Water Resources Recovery Facility (CRWRRF) Drainage District approves the Maintenance Assessment Recommendation and Special Assessment Roll for current and future fiscal years. Included in the development of the Maintenance Assessment Recommendation and Special Assessment Roll is the Long-Range Plan (LRP) for both Major Maintenance and Capital Improvement Projects at the facility. Major Maintenance Projects represent the larger maintenance activities required for operation of the plant that are not considered to be a part of the standard, day-to-day operations and maintenance. Capital Improvement Projects include new construction, replacement of existing assets and/or work that extends the useful life of the existing assets.

Operations staff has evaluated the conditions of both the Auburn plant and the East Boulevard plant, which together make up the Clinton River Water Resources Recovery Facility, and compiled the attached project list which includes ongoing projects as well as projects to be initiated for Fiscal Year 2024.

The attached tables provide a list of FY 2022 and 2023 projects that have been previously approved and are currently in-progress. Of the projects in progress, the cells in the "Total Project Budget" column that are highlighted yellow, require a budget amendment to complete the work.

Also included in the tables is a list of proposed FY 2024 projects that have yet to be initiated. These projects would be created at the end of FY 2023, but no expenses would hit the reserve funds until FY 2024.

WRC staff recommends amending the existing project budgets as shown on these tables and initiating the projects for FY 2024.

Requested Action: Approve the proposed projects and amended project budgets as identified on the attached tables using funds from the Major Maintenance and Capital Improvement reserves.

GRANTOR and GRANTEE (individually, "Party" or, collectively, the "Parties") will remain responsible for any and all claims arising out of its own acts and/or omissions during the performance of the Agreement, as provided by this Agreement or by law. This Agreement is not intended to increase or decrease either Party's liability for or immunity from tort claims. This Agreement is not intended to, nor will it be interpreted as giving either Party a right of indemnification, either by contract or by law, for claims arising out of the performance of this Agreement.

f. It is understood that the easement, rights, and privileges granted herein are nonexclusive, and GRANTOR reserves and retains the right to convey similar easements and rights to such other persons as GRANTOR may deem proper provided such similar easements do not materially affect GRANTEE'S use of the Easement Areas.

g. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto, their heirs, representatives, successors and assigns.

h. A map of the above-described Easement Areas is attached hereto.

i. This instrument contains the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the rights herein granted and the obligations herein assumed. Any oral representations or modifications concerning this instrument shall be of no force and effect. 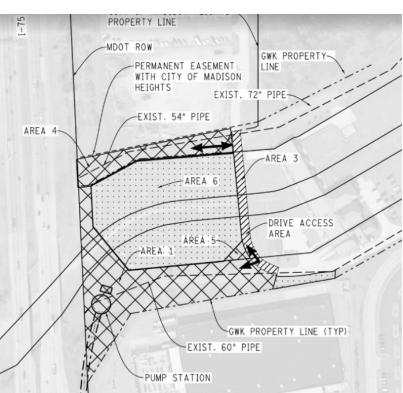

In accordance with our discussions, we have performed a structural analysis of the George W. Kuhn (GWK) Drain at the site to define allowable surcharge loading from various construction activities.

Upon reviewing the historical documents, we have estimated the structural capacity of the GWK Drain at various sections (original construction, original construction with center support added, and expansion construction). Based on our analysis, we have developed construction surcharge limits for the laydown areas shown in Figure No. 1

FKE recommends the following construction surcharge limits for the various laydown areas indicated in Figure No. 1:

- Area 1 Due to the majority of this area not being directly over the GWK Drain, • allowable sustained surcharge from construction activities can be up to 500 psf, (pounds per square foot) as long as they maintain a minimum of 10 foot clearance from the outside walls of the GWK Drain itself. For the portion of Area 1 that is directly over the original construction (with no center support), no sustained construction surcharge loading should be permitted. Only equipment traveling between the northern portion of Area 1 / Area 4 to the southern portion of Area 1 and vice versa should be permitted. This moving construction surcharge should be limited to 150 psf at the depth of the roof of the Drain. For example, in consideration that the roof is about 10 feet deep in this area and considering a 1(horizontal):2(vertical) stress distribution, a piece of construction equipment that is 8 feet wide and 12 feet long and that exerts 150 psf of distributed stress at the depth of the roof, would weigh approximately 30 tons. This is an example - - the Contractor should perform an analysis of each piece of equipment (including crane mats as necessary to distribute the load) to determine if it conforms to the limitation of 150 psf or less at the level of the roof.
- Area 3 (Ajax Drive) This road should only have construction traffic that is similar to the loading that takes place during normal facility operations and that has historically crossed the Drain. This truck traffic load is limited to a gross vehicle weight of 80,000 lbs., 20,000 lbs. on a single axle, and 34,000 lbs. on a tandem axle group, which is consistent with FHWA guidelines for the Interstate Highway System. Construction truck traffic higher than this limit should not be permitted to cross over the Drain.
- Area 5 While this area is over the expansion portion of the GWK Drain, construction truck traffic consistent to Area 3 may be permitted to drive over this area. In addition, light construction surcharge loading consistent with Area 6 may also be permitted.
- Area 6 Light construction parking and storage may be permitted directly over the expansion portion of the GWK Drain. This sustained loading should be less than 150 psf at the roof of the drain (similar to Area 1). No light construction parking and storage should be permitted within 5 feet of the original constructed portion of the outside walls of GWK (approx. 70 ft width).

The Evergreen-Farmington Sewage Disposal System (EFSD) and the City of Lathrup Village have Administrative Consent Orders with the State of Michigan to eliminate sanitary sewer overflows per EGLE's Sanitary Sewer Overflow Policy Statement. It was determined that the most efficient project to improve water quality in the region was a joint project to increase the capacity of the Lathrup Village Sewage Retention Tank and grade separate the tank from the Evergreen Interceptor, allowing EFSD to push additional capacity downstream. This partnership between EFSD and the City of Lathrup Village will improve operations and the environment. The project benefits both parties and, therefore, costs are shared by both parties. The attached agreement was reviewed through a series of stakeholder meetings with representatives from both the EFSD and the City of Lathrup Village. The stakeholder group and WRC staff recommend approval of this agreement.

Recommended Actions:

Approve the agreement between the Evergreen-Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District and the City of Lathrup Village as presented and authorize the Chairperson of the Board to execute the agreement.

CITY OF LATHRUP VILLAGE PROJECT COST SHARING AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made this January __, 2023 by and between the Evergreen-Farmington Sanitary Drain Drainage District ("EFSD"), a Michigan statutory corporation organized pursuant to Chapter 20 of the Michigan Drain Code, Act No. 40 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1956, as amended ("Drain Code"), by and through its drain board and City of Lathrup Village, a Michigan municipal corporation organized whose address is 27400 Southfield Road, Lathrup Village, Michigan 48076 ("City"). In this Agreement, either the EFSD or the City may also be referred to individually as a "Party" or jointly as the "Parties."

Recitals:

WHEREAS, the City owns a sanitary retention tank, including related components, as generally itemized in the attached **Exhibit** A and as it may be expanded or altered from time to time (the "System"); and

WHEREAS, the Parties have agreed to allocation of capital costs of certain improvements to the City's System, including but not limited to its sanitary retention tank facilities, as is described in the attached **Exhibit B**, the Lathrup Village Sanitary Retention Tank Improvements, Preliminary Estimate of Project Costs revised January 3, 2023 (hereinafter referred to as the "Project" or "System Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, EFSD is managing the construction of the Project and System Improvements,

WHEREAS, the Parties each have been authorized to execute this Agreement according to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, representations, and agreements in this Agreement, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which is acknowledged, the EFSD and the City mutually agree as follows:

Article I. Statement of Authority and Purpose.

- 1.1. <u>Authority</u>. Pursuant to applicable laws of the state of Michigan, the EFSD and the City enter into this Agreement to establish terms and conditions for the sharing of costs for the Project for System Improvements. Each Party must take all actions reasonably necessary to effectuate the objectives in this Agreement.
- 1.2. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is to memorialize the Parties' respective obligations to pay for the System Improvements.

Article II. Cost Sharing.

2.1. <u>Cost Sharing</u>. Except as provided herein, the Parties are responsible as follows for the capital costs of the System Improvements: City 25% and EFSD 75%. The estimate of projects costs are described in Exhibit B. The percentage allocation will apply to all System Improvements capital costs even in the event of the Project costs exceed estimates.

2.2. <u>Payment and Reimbursement of Project Costs</u>. The City must pay the amounts owed under this Agreement within thirty (30) days of the City's receipt of invoicing from the EFSD. The City provides by virtue of this Agreement its prior written authorization for the expenditure of funds from the City's System Enterprise Fund and EFSD may, in its sole discretion, also arrange for payment from the System Enterprise Fund.

Article III. EFSD Responsibilities.

- 3.1. <u>Permit Assistance</u>. Subject to rules and regulations which may be changed, developed or amended from time to time, the EFSD may assist the City in the procurement of all permits, guarantees, warranties, easements, licenses, and other similar approvals and consents necessary to construct the System Improvements. The Parties agree to fully cooperate and use good faith efforts to secure all necessary permits required by the state of Michigan, including but not limited to the Department of Energy, Great Lakes, and the Environment ("EGLE").
- 3.2. <u>Project Management</u>. EFSD is responsible for the project management of the Project and the construction of the System Improvements.

Article IV. City Responsibilities.

- 4.1. <u>Property Access</u>. The City is responsible for and will secure the right of access to all property necessary for WRC Personnel or Contractors to perform the System Improvements. The City is responsible for all costs or claims associated with securing such rights of access.
- 4.2. <u>Compliance with State and Federal Law and Regulations</u>. The City is and will remain responsible for all costs associated with compliance with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, and requirements in any manner affecting any System Improvements or performance of this Agreement or with any City duty or obligation under any applicable state or federal laws and/or regulations or any operations, maintenance, or administration contract respecting the System.
- 4.3. <u>The System Ownership</u>. Notwithstanding any other term or condition in this Agreement, no provision in this Agreement is intended, nor shall it be construed, as constituting a divestiture or forfeiture of the City's absolute ownership of and authority over the System.
- 4.4. <u>Payment</u>. The City is responsible for the timely payment of amounts owed pursuant to this Agreement.

Article V. Force Majeure and No Third Party Beneficiary.

5.1. <u>Force Majeure; System Malfunction; Misuse or Vandalism of the System</u>. The City is responsible for damage and liability to the System or components thereof caused by flood, fire, Acts of God or other force majeure, civil disturbance, Acts of War, terrorism or misuse of property. In addition, the City is responsible for all claims, damages and liability caused by design and/or construction defects, malfunction or failure of the System or any

component thereof, water loss, main breaks, hydrant damage and vandalism provided the same is not directly caused by the acts or omissions of EFSD Agents.

5.2. <u>No Third Party Beneficiary</u>. This Agreement does not create any rights or benefits to parties other than the City and the EFSD.

Article VI. Cooperation, Communication, and Dispute Resolution.

6.1. <u>Dispute Resolution</u>. The Parties agree that any and all claims alleging a breach of this Agreement must first be submitted to an alternative dispute resolution process. Such an alternative dispute resolution process may include, but is not limited to, facilitation, binding arbitration, or non-binding arbitration. The Parties must agree upon the form and procedures for the agreed upon alternative dispute resolution process. If the matter is not resolved through an alternative dispute resolution process, or if the Parties cannot agree upon the form and procedures for the alternative dispute resolution process, the Parties may seek legal recourse in a court of competent jurisdiction. For claims requiring immediate relief to prevent irreparable harm or for declaratory or injunctive relief, either Party may seek relief directly from a court of competent jurisdiction without submitting the matter to the alternative dispute resolution process.

Article VII. Agreement Approval; Effective Date; and Amendments.

- 7.1. <u>Agreement Approval; Amendments; and Effective Date</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, this Agreement and/or any subsequent amendments shall not become effective before the approval by resolutions of both the City and the EFSD. The Effective Date of this Agreement, and any amendments hereto, must be the date as reflected in the opening paragraph of this Agreement.
- 7.2. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended only in a writing signed by the Parties.

Article VIII. General Provisions.

- 8.1. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Agreement is made and entered into in the state of Michigan and shall in all respects be interpreted, enforced and governed under the laws of the state of Michigan. The language of all parts of this Agreement is intended to and, in all cases, must be construed as a whole according to its fair meaning, and not construed strictly for or against any party. As used in this Agreement, the singular or plural number, possessive or non-possessive shall be deemed to include the other whenever the context so suggests or requires.
- 8.2. <u>Reservation of Rights; Governmental Function</u>. This Agreement does not, and is not intended to impair, divest, delegate, or contravene any constitutional, statutory, and/or other legal right, privilege, power, obligation, duty, or immunity of the Parties. In addition, the Parties maintain that the obligations set forth in this Agreement will be in the exercise or discharge of a governmental function.
- 8.3. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement or the application to any person or circumstance is, to any extent, judicially determined to be invalid or unenforceable, the

remainder of the Agreement, or the application of the provision of persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is invalid or unenforceable, is not affected and is enforceable, provided the invalid provision does not substantially alter the Agreement or make execution impractical.

- 8.4. <u>Binding Contract; Assignment; and Amendments</u>. This Agreement will be binding upon and for the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns, subject to any assignment requiring the prior written consent of the non-assigning Party by an amendment to this Agreement signed by all Parties, and the assignee binding the assignee to the terms and provisions of this Agreement.
- 8.5. <u>Captions</u>. The section headings or titles and/or all section numbers in this Agreement are intended for the convenience of the reader and not intended to have any substantive meaning and are not to be interpreted as part of this Agreement.
- 8.6. <u>Notices</u>. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, any and all correspondence, invoices, and/or any other written notices required, permitted or provided for under this Agreement to be delivered to the following:

- 8.7. <u>Notice Delivery</u>. Except with respect to notices of termination, all correspondence and written notices shall be considered delivered to a Party as of the date that such notice is deposited with sufficient postage with the U.S. Postal Service. Notices of termination must be personally delivered or sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, and shall be considered delivered to a party on the date of receipt as represented by the return receipt or by a proof of personal service.
- 8.8. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. The terms and conditions herein are contractual and are not a mere recital and that there are no other agreements, understandings, contracts, or representations between the EFSD and the City in any way related to the subject matter hereof, except as expressly stated herein. This Agreement must not be changed or supplemented orally and may be amended only as otherwise provided herein.

8.9. <u>Recitals and Exhibits</u>. The recitals and exhibits are integral to this Agreement.

- SUBJECT: Eldon Street Pump Station Actuator Addition Project for Approval
- DATE: February 28, 2023

WRC staff is recommending a capital improvement project to improve the operation of the Eldon Street Pump Station, located in Farmington Hills. This pump station operates during large wet weather events to overcome surcharged hydraulic conditions in the interceptor. During dry weather, sanitary flow travels through the site by gravity.

A project is recommended to address a flap gate located in this station. Because of the low volume of dry weather flow, it has been found that sanitary debris regularly becomes trapped in the flap gate. We recommend removal of the flap gate and replacing it with an actuated valve that will not impede dry weather flow through the site. The actuator will automatically close the valve if the level in the wet well begins to rise and pump operation is necessary. This will eliminate the clogging of the gravity line and still provide grade protection when the interceptor is surcharged.

This project has an estimated cost of \$50,000.

Board Action Requested:

Approve the Eldon Street Pump Station Actuator Addition capital improvement project for the budgeted amount of \$50,000.
