- □ Keep gas tank full.
- □ Do not drive through a flooded area.
- ☐ Be aware of areas where flooding have receded.
- ☐ If a power line falls on your car, you are at risk of electrical shock; stay inside until a trained person removes the wire.
- ☐ Ensure adequate antifreeze levels.
- ☐ Battery and ignition system should be in top condition and battery terminals should be clean.
- ☐ Brakes: Check wear and fluid levels.
- □ Exhaust system: Check for leaks and crimped pipes and repair or replace as necessary. Carbon monoxide is deadly and usually gives no warning.
- ☐ Fuel and air filters: Replace and keep water out of the system by using additives and maintaining a full tank of gas.
- ☐ Heater and defroster: Ensure they work properly.
- ☐ Lights and flashing hazard lights should be checked to ensure serviceability.
- Check oil levels and weight. Heavier oils congeal more at low temperature and do not lubricate as well.
- ☐ Thermostat: Ensure it works properly.
- ☐ Windshield wiper equipment: Repair any problems and maintain proper washer fluid level.
- ☐ Install good winter tires. Make sure they have adequate tread. All-weather radials are usually good for most winter conditions.



Get emergency notification for critical incidents in Oakland County like:

- Siren activation
- Shelter-In-Place orders
- Significant road closures
- Major health events
- Chemical spills
- Active assailant/violent attack
- Interruption of county operations
