

Located minutes from I-75, Independence Oaks County Park offers overnight camping for organized youth groups including churches, scouts, day camps and more.

The primitive campground is nestled within the 1,268acre park, surrounded by a wooded area and an open field. Wilderness Bridge leads campers to the 10-acre site.

Camping information:

- Two group areas 40 campers and 100 campers
- Site 1 has one platform tent (four beds) Site 2 has one platform tent (four beds)
- Each area features a pavilion with water and electricity, accommodating up to 100
- Sites include fire rings, benches, grills and picnic tables
- A shared heated, modern bathhouse offers showers and restrooms (located on Site 2)
- Camping areas are a 2-5 minute walk from parking lot. Drive-up and drop-off is not available.
- Camping is open May 1-mid October; no winter camping

From Camp Wilderness, youth campers have access to:

- Wint Nature Center exhibits, wildlife feeding area and personalized programs by trained naturalists
- · More than 12 miles of hiking trails
- Swimming beach
- · Archery Range
- Fishing on 68-acre Crooked Lake
- Recreation clinics such as the "Learn to Fish"
- 2.2-mile paved path connecting to the Independence Township bike path system

Fees:

- · 2 adults per 10 youth campers required
- Campsite 1: \$100/night
- Campsite 2: 150/night
- Both Campsites: \$225/night

Price includes:

- Vehicle entry, one group area, pavilion, flag poles
- Campsite 1 One platform tent (4 beds)
- Campsite 2 One platform tent (4 beds)
- Shared heated modern bathhouse with showers and restrooms
- Water, electricity, charcoal grills, fire rings, picnic tables and trash containers
