

Main Street Grants Catalog

This resource was compiled for the Main Street Oakland County (MSOC) Grants Resources and Support Workshop held on November 13, 2024. The catalog has been compiled and condensed from a working database to highlight the active and most relevant grant opportunties. The grant database is based on research by MSOC staff and is targeted for Main Street America member communities and small businesses located in downtown districts and walkable commerical corridors in Oakland County, Michigan.

Each grant entry includes the name of the grant making authority, the grant name, the type of funding, eligibility requirements, description of the grant, grant amount or range, grant deadlines, and website. In terms of anticipated deadlines, this database will frequently include best estimates supported by historical data. Grant opportunities are often announced 4-8 weeks before the grant deadline, so it can be difficult to know the exact date. Many follow a fairly consistent annual or quarterly cycle, as long as funding is available. Each grant has been categorized under one or more of the Main Street Four Points: Design, Organization, Promotion and Economic Vitality. There are also subcategories within the Four Points. The document is organized into three secsions: 1. Community, 2. Small Business, and 3. Other.

The intent of this document is to help local Main Street managers develop a Grants Calendar and plan for grant opportunities 12-18 months in advance.

Description: The AARP Community Challenge Demonstration Grants supports projects that encourage the replication of promising efforts that benefit residents (especially those age 50 and older). While there is not a defined budget range for this category, similar projects have tended to fall between \$10,000 and \$20,000 and will not exceed \$50,000. Project categories include digital connectivity to prepare and respond to disasters, equitable engagement to reconnect communities, and housing choice design competitions.

Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grants Program

Funding Source: Federal

Eligibility: Rural Communities as subgrant reciepients (Eligible subgrant properties must be listed in the National Register of Historic Places or determined eligible for listing at the National, State, or local level of significance and located within rural (non-urban) communities with populations less than 5)

Description: The Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grant Program, named in honor of the late preservation leader from Vermont, fosters economic development in rural communities through the rehabilitation of historic buildings in those communities. The program provides recipients (referred to as prime grantees) with a single grant that is then regranted in smaller amounts to individual projects (subgrants). Grant awards may range from \$200,000 to \$750,000 to the prime grantee. The program is administered by the National Park Service. funding for the program is dependent on Congressional appropriations for the FY. The intent of this program is to provide funds that can be regranted to projects that have been selected through a locally administered competitive process after the prime grant is awarded.

African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund

Description: This grant is designed to advance place-based cultural heritage preservation projects for historic places representing African American cultural heritage. Funding supports work in four primary areas: Capital Projects, Organizational Capacity Building, Project Planning, and Programming and Interpretation. Grants can range from \$50,000 -\$150,000. 15% of funding can be used for architectural and engineering fees.
