Memorandum for Revocable License to Use Drain Easement

- SUBJECT: Revocable License to Use Drain Easement
- DATE: September 21, 2022

The City of Warren is rehabilitating the Denton Drive Bridge which crosses the Red Run Drain north of Chicago Road between Mound Road and Van Dyke Road. A permit has been issued to City of Warren's contractor, C.A. Hull Co., Inc. (Contractor) for the rehabilitation project. The Red Run Intercounty Drain Drainage District (Drain District) has certain easement rights located in Warren, adjacent to the Denton Street Bridge. The Contractor has requested temporary use of the easement for the following purposes: (1) staging associated with the rehabilitation of the Denton Drive Bridge, and (2) access to make improvements to the embankment slopes on either side of the Drain under the bridge and armoring drain banks with heavy rip-rap over geotextile fabric.

The Contractor's request for use of the easement was reviewed by the law firm of Aloia Law, located in Mt. Clemens, Michigan. Legal counsel from Aloia Law advised that is permissible for the Drain District to grant the Contractor a revocable license to use a portion of the easement for the above-stated purposes related to rehabilitation of the Denton Drive Bridge. A proposed Revocable License to Use Drain Easement is attached hereto. The proposed license contains appropriate and standard indemnity and insurance provisions, as well as mandatory compliance with applicable local, state, and federal laws, ordinances, and regulations.

Recommended Action:

Authorize the Chairperson of this Board to execute the attached Revocable License to Use Drain Easement to the City of Warren's contractor, C.A. Hull Co., Inc.

REVOCABLE LICENSE TO USE DRAIN EASEMENT

This Revocable License to Use Drain Easement is made this ______ day of ______, 2022, by and between the RED RUN INTERCOUNTY DRAIN DRAINAGE DISTRICT, acting through the Red Run Intercounty Drain Drainage Board, whose address is c/o Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner, Public Works Building, One Public Works Drive, Waterford, Michigan, 48328 (hereinafter referred to as the "Drain District") and C.A. HULL CO., INC., a Michigan corporation, whose address is 8177 Goldie Road, Commerce Township, Michigan 48390 (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee").

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Easement Deed dated April 16, 1952, and recorded on April 17, 1952, in Liber 860, Page 422, Macomb County Records, and the Quit Claim Deed dated June 27, 1955, and recorded on July 26, 1955, in Liber 1008, Page 262, Macomb County Records, the Drain District possesses and controls within in its jurisdiction a permanent easement for the "perpetual right to enter upon the [land] and to construct, occupy, maintain, repair, operate and patrol the Red Run Channel" ("Easement Rights").

WHEREAS, the Drain District's Easement Rights are located in the City of Warren, Michigan, and adjacent to the Denton Street Bridge.

WHEREAS, Licensee desires to use a portion of the Drain District's Easement Rights for temporary storage of material and/or equipment for the Denton Bridge Rehabilitation Project ("Encroachment") in the location depicted in **Exhibit A** ("License Area").

WHEREAS, to the extent that it can, the Drain District is willing to license and permit the Licensee a revocable license for the Encroachment within the License Area.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following mutual covenants and conditions, the Drain District hereby authorizes and grants to Licensee a revocable license to utilize the License Area, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. It is the intention of the Drain District by granting this Revocable License to convey, to the extent that it has such right to convey, the non-exclusive right to use the License Area for the Encroachment, which may be revoked at any time and for any reason at the discretion of the Drain District. It is not the Drain District's intention to create or grant any permanent easement or covenant right or interest in the Drain District's Easement Rights for the benefit of the Licensee.

- 2. Licensee recognizes and agrees that it is licensed to utilize the License Area only for the Encroachment, and that this License is subservient to the priority Easement Rights of the Drain District.
- 3. Licensee recognizes that it is to fully comply with the July 26, 2021 Water Resources Commission Approval Letter which is attached hereto as **Exhibit B** and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. Licensee recognizes and agrees that the Drain District has made no representation or warranty with regard to the Drain District's right to convey to Licensee the right to use the License Area for the Encroachment, but rather has disclosed that its rights to the License Area are limited to its Easement Rights described above. Furthermore, the Drain District has informed the Licensee that it does not have fee title to the License Area, and that this License shall not serve as the Drain District's representation or warranty that the Drain District has permission from the fee title owner to covey this License.
- 5. Licensee shall provide for the installation and maintenance of the Encroachment in the License Area. Licensee agrees to maintain the Encroachment and the License Area in a neat and clean condition at all times and to keep the License Area free of accumulations of debris, sediment, snow, ice and noxious materials or conditions. Licensee agrees that flow will be maintained in the drain at all times during construction, and that related earth disruption conforms to applicable requirements of Part 91, Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control of the Natural Resource and Environmental Protection Act, Act 451 of the Public Acts of 1994. Licensee agrees that areas of disturbance within the License Area will be fully restored to the original condition existing prior to the commencement of the use at its completion of the Denton Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project.
- 6. Licensee shall comply with all local, state and federal laws, ordinances and regulations in its use of the License Area.
- 7. Licensee shall indemnify, defend and hold the Drain District, the County of Oakland, the County of Macomb, the Oakland County Water Resources Commissioner, the City of Warren, and their respective officers, contractors, agents, and employees harmless from any and all liability, damages, injuries, attorney's fees and/or costs arising from Licensee's (including its shareholders, officers, directors, agents, employees, assigns, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, laborers, guests and/or invitees) activities and use of the License Area.
- 8. Licensee shall not use the License Area in any manner that could interfere with the Drain District's operation or maintenance of the Red Run Inter-County Drain ("Drain") or increase the cost to the Drain District of performing any work on the Drain.

- 9. The License shall immediately terminate upon non-compliance with the terms and conditions set forth. Upon such termination, Licensee shall, within fourteen (14) days, remove the Encroachment and restore the Licensed Area so disturbed to the original condition existing prior to the commencement of the use, or as nearly as possible at its sole expense.
- 10. The Licensee understands and agrees that this License is subject to the rights of any utility which may now or in the future occupy the Licensed Area, and Licensee agrees to pay for, at its sole expense any and all utility relocation that may be required and repair of any damage to any utility due to this Encroachment.
- 11. Licensee has purchased Public Liability and Bodily Injury and Property Damage Insurance which is attached hereto as **Exhibit** C and incorporated herein by reference. Licensee and said insurance shall protect, defend, hold harmless and indemnify the Drain District against all claims for personal injuries or property damage resulting from and in connection with Licensee's use of the License Area for the Encroachment.
- 12. This License contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and the terms of this License are contractual and not a mere recital. This License incorporates all prior agreements and promises between the parties, whether written or oral.
- 13. If any provision of this License is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this License shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect.
- 14. This License cannot be changed orally, and no executory agreement shall be effective to waive, change, modify, or discharge it, in whole or in part, unless such executory agreement is in writing and is signed by the party against whom enforcement of any waiver, change, modification, or discharge is sought.
- 15. This License shall, in all respects, be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the substantive federal laws of the United States and the laws of the State of Michigan and venue for any dispute shall lie in Macomb County, Michigan.
- 16. Any notice pursuant to this License shall be given in writing by (a) personal delivery, (b) expedited delivery service with proof of delivery, or (c) United States registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, sent to the intended addressee at the address set forth on page 1 of this License, or to such other address or to the attention of such other person as the addressee shall have designated by written notice sent in accordance with this Section, and shall be deemed to have been given either at the time of personal delivery, or, in the case of expedited delivery service or mail, as of the date of the first attempted delivery at the address and in the manner provided in this Section, or, in the case of email or facsimile transmission, upon read receipt.

- 17. The individuals executing this Agreement warrant that they are duly authorized and fully empowered to execute this Agreement on behalf of their respective Parties.
- 18. This License may be recorded in the Macomb County Register of Deeds by the Drain District or Drain District's agent.
- 19. This License is exempt from transfer taxes under MCLA 207.505(a) and MCLA 207.526(a).



Dear Ms. Gapshes,

The Water Resources Commissioner's Office (WRC) has received plans for the abovementioned project prepared by Anderson, Eckstein and Westrick, Inc. dated March 2, 2021. A review of the plans indicates the following:

1. The proposed project will involve the Red Run Drain, a legally established inter-county drain maintained by WRC on behalf of the respective drainage district.

With reference to the submitted plans, involvement with the Red Run Drain is as follows:

- 1. Rehabilitate Denton Street bridge over the drain including pavement replacement and related appurtenances.
- 2. Regrade embankment slopes on either side of the drain under the bridge and armor with heavy rip-rap over geotextile fabric.
- 3. Tap drain with a 12" diameter RCP.

WRC has no objection to the proposed work provided:

- 1. That the applicant, or their contractor obtain the required drain permit from WRC.
- 2. The review fee for this permit is \$250. A \$2,000 inspection fee is also due at the time of permit issuance. The total cost of the permit is therefore \$2,250 and may be picked up at this office between 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Alternatively, you may call our main contact number (248-858-0958). One of our staff will arrange to receive credit card payment. Once paid, the permit will be emailed to you. Inspection services can be arranged by contacting our Inspection Department at 248-858-1105.







- 3. That a minimum 48-hour notice is given to our inspection department (248-858-1105) prior to any construction affecting the aforementioned inter-county drain.
- 4. The following are bonding requirements of the WRC for all county drain work:
 - A) \$5,000 surety bond on WRC form no. DC-443 available at: http://www.oakgov.com/water/Documents/2013 updates/dc 443 012013.pdf
 - B) \$500 cash bond posted at the WRC (refundable)
 - C) Liability insurance naming the WRC as an additional insured
- 5. That flow is maintained in the drain at all times during construction.
- 6. That the Water Resources Commissioner, the County of Oakland, and the Red Run Inter-County Drain Drainage District are held harmless from all costs, suits and damages which may arise out of the proposed construction.
- 7. That this final conditional approval will not relieve the applicant and/or their contractor of the responsibility of obtaining permits, approvals or clearances as may be required from federal, state or local authorities, the public utilities and private property owners.
- 8. That related earth disruption conforms to applicable requirements of Part 91, Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control of the Natural Resource and Environmental Protection Act, Act 451 of the Public Acts of 1994.
- 9. If the permit issued for this project is not picked up within 90 days of the date of this letter, this office will contact the applicant. If the applicant cannot be contacted, the applicant will be notified by mail that the permit and all approvals pertaining thereto will be rescinded.
